# **ADMISSIONS POLICY**

## **General**

Berkhampstead School is a co-educational independent school for pupils from ages 3 to 11. Children may enter the Nursery at 3 for which there is a maximum of 30. Following this there is a two form entry from Reception to Year 6, with a maximum of 18 pupils per class. Deciding on the right school for your child is very important, and we believe that a personal visit is invaluable. We very much hope that you and your children will visit Berkhampstead School. We hold a number of Open Days, which give a general introduction to the school. Details are published on our web site. ## **The Entry Procedure**

Berkhampstead School will ask for your children to attend a 'Taster Day' at the school, to assess if he/she will fit in well in the school, and to ensure Berkhampstead is the right school for your child. References from child's previous school may be requested. Scholarship examinations take place in March for children in Year 2, for scholarships applicable for Year 3-6.

## **Registration**

Berkhampstead School asks for a deposit upon registration to hold a place for your children from the age of 5. 35% of this deposit is returned as a credit against your first term's fee and 50% of this deposit is returned on leaving the school, once all bills are paid. Children who attend the Sure Start Free for 3 and 4 years olds 15 hours in the Nursery do not pay this deposit unless they wish to hold a place for them in Reception.

## **Special Needs**

We do not discriminate in any way regarding entry. We welcome pupils with special educational needs, providing that our Learning Support Department can offer them the support that they require. We welcome pupils with physical disabilities provided that our site can cope with them. However, we advise parents of children with special educational needs or physical disabilities to discuss their child's requirements with the School.

We will discuss thoroughly with parents and their medical advisers the adjustments that can reasonably be made for the child if he/she becomes a pupil at the school.

## **The Assessment Process**

The aim of the process is to identify potential. We are looking for well-rounded pupils with a genuine interest in education in the broadest sense of the word, with interests

that stretch beyond the confines of the academic curriculum. The school has strong traditions in music, sport, drama and art. There are many extra-curricular activities, all of which are important in developing a well-balanced, confident individual.

### **Sibling Policy**

Most siblings join us at Berkhamstead School. However, admission is not automatic, and it is recommended that the sibling is registered as soon as possible in order to ensure a place is available.

### **Bursaries**

The Governors of the School do provide bursaries for children who otherwise would be unable to attend the School. We offer means tested awards, which are reviewed annually. Both parents are required to provide proof of their income and assets. The level of support varies according to parental need; but can extend to full fee remission in cases of proven need. Before the offer of a bursary is confirmed, a member of staff will normally visit the family at their home.

Bursaries are always offered for 12 months at a time. The family is required to provide fresh information each March about its circumstances for every year that their child attends the school. Level of support may vary with fluctuations in income.

### **Religious Beliefs**

Although Berkhamstead School has Christian roots, we do not select for entry on the basis of religious belief.
