#### Flexi staff - Pat, Jessica, Giovanna


We have extended our zero hours team too... with Ruth, who many of you will recognise from previously working in the Day Nursery.

## **COVID AMENDMENTS**

Following your feedback, I have made a few changes to the Covid Policy and Procedures and hope to be able to continue with these; however, if anything changes, I will have to revert back to tighter restrictions. I of course will let you know and hope we do not have to move backwards; however, we have a clear contingency plan in place should Covid 19 cases rise within the Day Nursery.

Previously, you collected your little one on your own. Moving forward, you will be able to collect your child with someone else (mum, dad, grandparents etc.)

You are now welcome to come into your child's room for handover.

Previously your little one was not able to come back to Nursery following a temperature, until 48 hours after a negative Covid test. Moving forward, your child can return to Nursery following their negative result without having to wait another 48 hours.

Calpol will be administered at the Practitioners' discretion. As always, we only give paracetamol for teething and children should not attend Nursery if they are needing to have paracetamol before attending. If your child is teething but has a temperature, we will not be able to give them paracetamol.

If you have any queries or questions, please let me know. Of course, this is a personal choice, and you are more than welcome to continue wearing masks and not entering your child's room.









# **BEAR CUBS:**

For baby bears from 3 - 18 months

This month, the children have been exploring different materials during sensory play: pom poms, feathers and shaving foam. They have all loved this!

We have also been supporting Children in Need and raising lots of money; they

have been able to do a Teddy Bears' Picnic for which we used crushed Weetabix and placed the children's teddies inside the sensory tray.

We are also introducing the children to different animals and again set up a farmyard within the sensory tray. The children have loved hearing the different noises and have attempted some themselves too.

We set out a painting activity for "World Prematurity Day"; the children used their hands to create different marks, using purple paints.

# **CUDDLY BEARS:** For toddler bears 18 - 24 months

This month, the children have been learning about "Children in

Need". We had different themed days throughout the week such as Pl Day and Spotty Day, Teddy Bears' Picnic and Cake Decorating and Fancy Dress Day.

We decorated a large Pudsey bear, exploring

different materials for sticking such as crepe paper and tissue paper. We used a variety of colours and textures to create a lovely rainbow-coloured Pudsey!


We loved making our very own rice crispy cakes, taking it in turns to mix, shake and stir the ingredients, along with spooning the mixture into individual cases and learning about hot and cold with the melted chocolate.

We have also been exploring different scents through playdoh, such as parsley and mint, and mixing real flowers into the mixture.

We look forward to our Christmas celebrations this month and have already begun salt dough

to see what your little one has been up to!The Christmas tree will be making an appearance very soon, along with Christmas goody bags, as it is never too early.











# FUZZY BEARS: For growing bears 2 - 21/2

In Fuzzy Bears, we are enjoying lots of construction play - building towers and using tractors and diggers to scoop different materials.

We have also been looking at different experiments to encourage the children's curiosity in their play. We have created volcanoes and explored them whilst they erupt, as well as searching for

spiders' webs in the garden to look at how unique each one is.

We have loved all the brilliant activities for Children in Need Week - making a wonderful Pudsey Bear which all the children helped to decorate with matching masks and lots of colour matching.

We have enjoyed making our own fireworks following the children's real-life experiences of seeing them a few weeks ago. This week for Children in Need, we have been doing lots of Pudsey-related activities, which has led to the children showing an interest in the theme "Teddy Bears' Picnic". We have been setting up pretend picnics and all the children have brought in their own teddies too to have a picnic with! Linking in with Pudsey Bear, we have had different coloured playdough spots in our sensory tray and have done a spotty hunt in the garden for which the children had to go and find certain coloured spots which were hiding!

The children really enjoyed going over to the school cookery room to make their flapjacks to raise money for Children in Need too; they did such a great job working together as a team and taking turns.

Following the children's interests, we have also made a baby role play area and a new construction area with diggers and stones. We have also been getting messy in our dinosaur sensory tray - making green gloop for the dinosaurs to stomp around in!
