### NEWS FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL

Dear Parents

In Monday's assembly, I spoke about Anti-Bullying Week 2025, which began with Odd Socks Day - a fun and colourful way for pupils and staff to celebrate individuality, with everyone sporting odd socks or jazzy tights. This year's theme, 'Power for Good', encouraged pupils to reflect on how we can all use our voices to stand up for kindness. We discussed the importance of speaking out when we witness unkind behaviour, rather than staying silent or joining in. Throughout the week, pupils took part in activities during their CWB (Citizenship and Wellbeing) and form times, exploring how to make positive choices and support one another. I also reminded everyone that they can always talk to any trusted adult in school if something is worrying them, and we revisited the acronyms STOP - Several Times On Purpose - and Start Telling Other People. At Berkhampstead, the happiness and wellbeing of our pupils are at the heart of everything we do, and we remain committed to providing exceptional pastoral care. We are also proud to continue holding the Gloucestershire Healthy Living and Learning Award, an achievement we have maintained since 2017.

On Monday at I I am, the Prep School gathered to honour those who have given their lives in conflict, observing a two-minute silence in remembrance. Early Years and Pre-Prep children also took part, sitting silently as they watched 'Poppies' which is the two-minute CBeebies animation. In the lead up to Remembrance Day, assemblies and activities across the school helped deepen the children's understanding of this important occasion. Remembrance Day holds a special place in our hearts here at Berky. In 1914, three young men - Douglas Burgoyne Burgoyne-Wallace, Harold Charles Edward Barrett, and John Roland Barrett - lived in Beechmount and Fernbank, now our Pre-Prep building, and sadly lost their lives as a consequence of WWI.

We celebrated Positive Noticing Day on Wednesday. In assemblies, form and circle times, children and staff reflected on the uplifting impact of recognising the good in one another, thus helping build self-esteem and fostering positive feelings within our school community. It was heart-warming to read the children's thoughtful comments about their peers, and a pleasure to write my own messages.

I was pleased to see members of our Prep Eco Committee litter picking around the school grounds recently - a great example of pupils taking pride in their environment. Berkhampstead proudly holds the Eco-Schools Green Flag Award, recognising our ongoing commitment to sustainability. We are also pleased to be working with a new cleaning materials supplier who

share our values and bring with them a host of impressive eco credentials, further supporting our efforts to make Berkhampstead a greener school.



As soon as we made these adjustments, the momentum began to shift.

Despite falling behind 7–5, the boys showed fantastic resilience, pulling the score back to 7–6.



In a dramatic final play, Walker spotted space out wide, backed his pace, and dived into the corner to secure a well-earned 7–7 draw. It was a thrilling end to a fiercely competitive match, and both teams can be proud of the rugby they played.

There was plenty to learn from the performance, and next week in training we'll be focusing on creating space, running onto the ball with confidence, and continuing to develop our decision-making at the breakdown.
