Dear Parents,

My assemblies this week were inspired by Ellie Goldstein, a contestant on the current series of Strictly Come Dancing and the first person with Down Syndrome to compete in the show. We explored the theme of disabilities and differences, discussing how some disabilities can be hidden, and we learnt more about conditions such as cerebral palsy and autism. Together, we reflected on how we are all different, all special, and how kindness and respect towards one another are so important — qualities that will be celebrated at the end of the week when I present the Kindness Cups.

This week was an exciting one for our Early Years children, who were visited by Little City Gloucestershire for a morning full of imaginative role-play activities. The children explored a variety of real-world scenarios, including a mini supermarket, post office, hairdressers and a garage. They took on roles as hairdressers, firefighters, builders and café owners, using their imaginations to bring each setting to life. A big thank you to the PTA for funding this fantastic workshop for the second year!

All of our Prep pupils have been making the most of the Cheltenham Literature Festival this week. Year 3 were inspired by the brilliant Cressida Cowell, author and illustrator of 'How to Train Your Dragon', Year 4 were treated to Maz Evans' lively presentation, 'The Last Bard', and Years 5 and 6 enjoyed children's laureate Frank Cottrell-Boyce's engaging talk, 'The Blockbusters!'. We are certainly fortunate to have such a noteworthy literary festival here in Cheltenham.
