#### **OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT** IN MATHEMATICS

Last term, one of our talented pupils (then in Year 5) took part in the UKMT Junior Maths Challenge alongside 300,000 children nationwide, qualifying for the lunior Olympiad as one of the top 1,000 scorers. In June, he achieved an outstanding result in the Olympiad — a silver medal and book prize for finishing in the top 100 nationally, against children up to three years older. Congratulations on this exceptional achievement; we are so proud of you!

#### **BERKY FOOD AND NUTRITION**


Our wonderful Catering Manager, Rob, and the catering team have been working hard in providing us with fabulous meals again this term. You may be aware that the Department for Education have reinforced the importance of a healthy balanced diet in schools and from September

2025, new Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) guidance ensures that all early years settings provide healthier food and drink for children. The aim is to give every child the best start with their eating habits. Meals and snacks will be balanced, age-appropriate and varied, with clear guidance on portion sizes and weaning for younger children.

At school we already limit foods high in sugar, salt and unhealthy fats, such as sweetened yoghurts and sugary drinks are not served. Our children are offered fresh, nutritious options with water and milk as the only drinks provided. There is also stronger focus on allergy management, food safety and creating a positive mealtime environment where children can explore a range of healthy foods. These changes are designed to help children build healthy eating habits for life.

Please be reassured that whilst this was a useful opportunity to review our menus, not just for Early Years, we already think really carefully about the food on offer to the children. In addition our 'family dining' creates a really positive mealtime environment. A big thank you to our now in-house catering team who take such care over our daily nutrition.
