NEWS FROM RECEPTION

We've had a wonderfully busy week in Reception filled with learning, creativity and - dare we say - a little festive excitement creeping in from time to time!

This week we introduced the children to four new consonant digraphs in phonics. They have been working hard to spot them in words, practise blending in their reading and use them independently in their writing. We are so proud of how confident they are becoming with their phonics skills!

In our literacy sessions, the children have been reading and writing about the story Farmer Duck. They enjoyed exploring the characters - from the lazy, greedy farmer to the hardworking duck and his amazing team of animal companions. They've written some brilliant sentences, their progress in pencil control and handwriting is so evident over the last few weeks - we couldn't be prouder of the children.

In maths, we have been learning different ways to represent the numbers 4 and 5. The children explored these numbers using counters, Numicon, tens frames and even through stories and songs. They are developing a strong understanding of how numbers can be made and shown in many ways and their subitising skills are super speedy!

In our Understanding of the World lessons, we have begun learning about how Christmas is celebrated in different countries. The children loved discovering new traditions, foods and customs from around the world and enjoyed Miss Kang-Martinez sharing her own experiences of Christmas. This has sparked lots of curiosity and wonderful conversations! The children have been very excited to start creating their family calendars using digital art on the iPads. They experimented with colours, shapes and simple design tools to make something special to take home for Christmas. We can't wait for you to see their creations!

Mrs Sallis has been working her magic in music lessons, as we've been practising our Christmas songs ready for our performance in a few weeks. The children have shown great enthusiasm and can't wait to share their singing with you soon.
