Mark B took part in the UKMT Senior Maths Challenge – a national competition usually entered by A Level Maths students – and was placed in the top 10% nationally. A phenomenal achievement! Meanwhile, Starlar H has also been offered a place in the National Children Orchestra, celebrating her outstanding musical ability. We couldn't be prouder of our Year 6 pupils and their accomplishments.

We are so excited to be back at school for our second half term in Reception! The children have bounced back in with big smiles, full of wonderful stories about their holidays.

This week, after reading Julia Donaldson's Room on the Broom, the children have been busy becoming mini magicians and scientists! Together we explored the world of potion making, using a variety of sensory ingredients such as colourful glitter, scented powders such as ground ginger, sparkly sequins and even some googly eyes! The children absolutely loved experimenting with mixing, pouring, and stirring — using all their senses to see what might happen when different materials combine such as flour, vinegar and oil. There were plenty of giggles and "wow!" moments as their potions bubbled. Our special challenge was to create a magical potion that could make toys come to life and we used the magic spell 'lggity, ziggety, zaggety zoom!' to help the potion along! In our writing session on Thursday, we then had a go at writing about our potions, where the progress with the children's phonics application was absolutely amazing!

We had a fun and rather muddy time out at Forest School on Monday afternoon, digging and creating potions in the mud kitchen. Please do make sure you child has a pair of waterproof trousers and wellingtons in school, as we like to go out in all winds and weathers.

During our Understanding of the World lessons this week we have loved learning about Guy Fawkes and this stimulated some amazing conversations. We went on to talk about being safe around bonfires and fireworks and created some spectacular firework art on Wednesday afternoon painting in the style of Jackson Pollock.
