### KINDERGARTEN

The children excitedly greeted each other after the half-term break. It's such a pleasure to see them enthusiastically participate in all the many activities and routines that occur daily in Kindergarten. This half-term we are following on from their interest with 'Time' and our 'Visual Time-table'.

This week we have been engaging the children in circle-time discussions about their daily activities, which will help them to build their understanding of sequencing. This is a very important concept for the children to develop, as it allows them to recognise patterns that make the world more understandable and predictable.

We asked the children to imagine that an alien wanted to have a sleep-over in Kindergarten. Could they explain how to get ready for bed? The children animatedly sequenced their own bedtime routines - bubbly baths to bedtime stories. We then welcomed our alien visitor and helped him get ready for bed, with all the necessary props – soap, toothbrush and sponge, etc. The children took turns to give each other instructions and directions very, very literally! 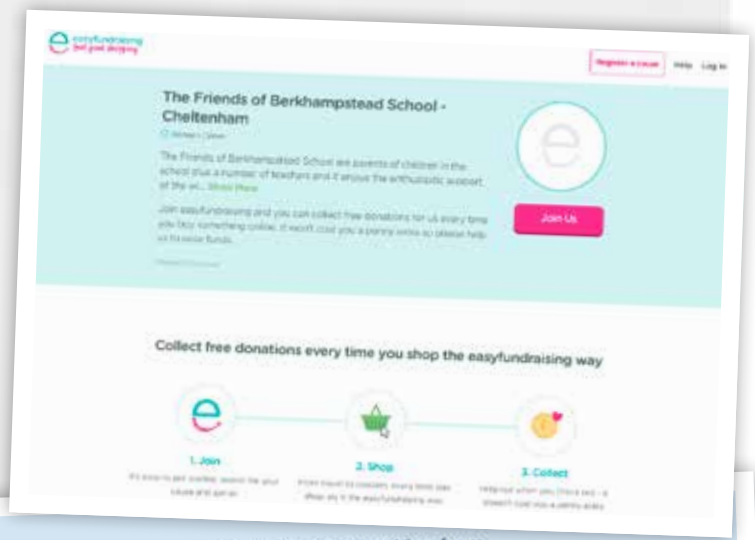
